Lee and Greens Moor Quarries are now an area for recreation and offer the opportunity to enjoy and understand both natural and industrial heritage of Rossendale. Some of this area has been classified as a Geological Site of Special Scientific Interest and many former quarry workings have been preserved for their heritage value.



### Mountain Biking Code Always follow the Quarry Cycle Code

#### Don't rely on others:

- can you get home safely?
- carry the right equipment and know how to use it

#### For your own safety:

- always wear the right safety clothing, at least a cycle helmet and gloves
- only cycle within your abilities
- only tackle jumps and other challenges if you are sure you can do them, have a look first!
- train properly especially for difficult and technical routes



#### On and off road:

- expect the unexpected - watch out for other visitors
- for your own and others' safety always follow warning signs and any advice you are given;
- Please Slow Down for Horses, some horses are easily spooked by bikes.
- If approaching a horse from behind please warn the rider of your presence by calling "bike behind"
- Lee Quarry is a multi user site and whilst we have designed a number of trails with Mountain bikers in mind you may find other users and livestock on them. Please ride within your limits and give way to other users.



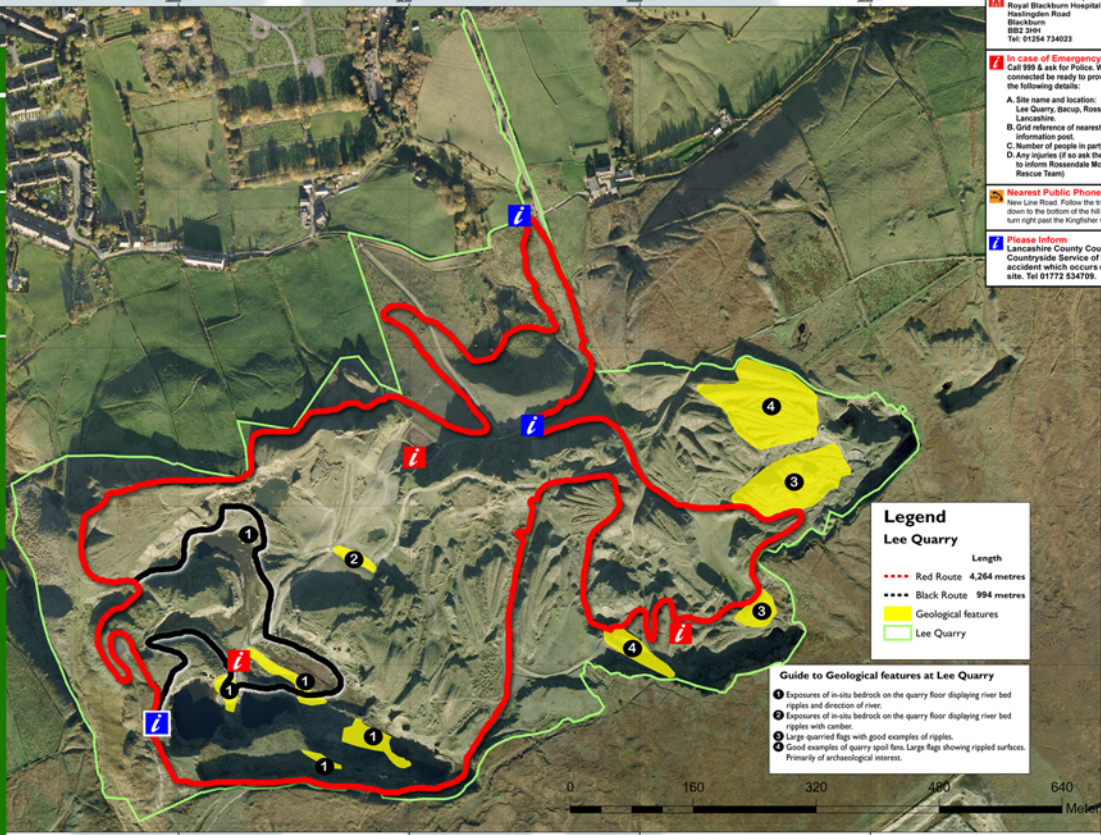
### Is This For You? Find the right trail grade for your abilities

Suitable For	Trail Surface & Type	Gradients & Technical Sections (TTT's)
Beginner mountain bike users used to technically challenging routes. Quality off-road mountain bike required.	Sleep and rocky, mostly no granite with technically challenging sections. Expect variable surface types. Note there are some black graded sections which you can opt in to along the route. These will be signed in advance and will be significantly more challenging.	Expect a large proportion of technical nature with rock gardens, medium drop offs, water crossings and bermed turns.
Expert mountain bike users used to technically challenging routes. Quality off-road mountain bike required. If you struggled with any of the red graded trail please consider whether this grade of trail is suitable for you.	Sleep and rocky, mostly singletrack with technically challenging sections. Expect variable surface types and a greater challenge and degree of difficulty than the red routes.	Expect large committing and unavoidable TTT's including rock gardens, drop offs and steep gradients.



If in doubt walk this section first (but keep your eyes open for others using the trail) We recommend you wear a helmet at all times whilst using these facilities.

  - Good examples of quarry spoil fans. Large flags showing rippled surfaces. Primarily of archaeological interest.
